HOME BAKED GOODS IN SCHOOL

You may be aware that a recent decision by Harford County Public Schools prevented all home-baked goods from being brought to school, even for adult consumption. Your PTSA believed this had a chilling effect on parental involvement in schools and created an economic hardship for PTA members who often donate, rather than purchase food for events such as Staff Appreciation Week. Your PTSA brought these concerns to the appropriate decision-makers and the policy has been changed. Home baked goods which follow health department guidelines will now be allowed in school for adult consumption and for student consumption when those students are under parental supervision.
